CONFESSION OF SINS

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

C: (Sung) Lord, have mercy on us. Christ, have mercy on us. Lord have mercy on us.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.

THE WORD

Old Testament Lesson: Deuteronomy 5:12-15 (NIV) *It is not mere idleness that is enjoined in the third commandment. The ultimate purpose of the Sabbath is the contemplation of God's mighty works and acts. He made us and not we ourselves; he saved us by his mighty and outstretched arm.*

¹² "Observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy, as the LORD your God has commanded you. ¹³ Six days you shall labor and do all your work, ¹⁴ but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your ox, your donkey or any of your animals, nor the alien within your gates, so that your manservant and maidservant may rest, as you do. ¹⁵ Remember that you were slaves in Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out of there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God has commanded you to observe the Sabbath day.

PSALM OF THE DAY : 126 on page 113

Epistle Lesson: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12 (NIV) *If the children of Israel had reason to come together and hear of the mighty acts of God, how much more reason we have to do the same. For we hear of Christ, the Savior from the slavery to sin and death. And in hearing the effective word of the gospel, we receive the light from God that preserves us in this life and will raise us up on the last day to worship him, our Savior, for all eternity.*

⁵For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. ⁷But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. ⁸We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not

destroyed. ¹⁰We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that his life may be revealed in our mortal body. ¹²So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you.

GOSPEL: Mark 2:23-28 (NIV) *The Pharisees missed all of the joy that God wanted to give them on the Sabbath. And Why? They did not really listen to the law they professed to know and love so well, nor to God's own commentary on it in the example of David. Their purpose was to concentrate on their own doing and not doing. God's purpose was to focus our attention on him and on his work for us. If we, like them, despise his Word, we too will miss its saving benefit and without that Word fall into error and unbelief.*

²³One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and as his disciples walked along, they began to pick some heads of grain. ²⁴The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?" ²⁵He answered, "Have you never read what David did when he

and his companions were hungry and in need? ²⁶In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he also gave some to his companions." ²⁷Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. ²⁸So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

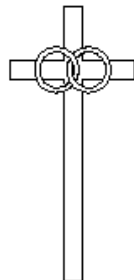
